HILL COLLEGE TADUBI

PROFILE:

Just as there is always something to tell about the origin of a thing or an institute which can be unique under peculiar conditions and circumstances, unlike other colleges of Manipur, Hill College, Tadubi, saw the light of day under direct sponsorship of the Government of Manipur as an Arts College with K. Asholi as Principal.

In view of the strong public demand for a college in the North District of Manipur some time ago, the Government felt the necessity of a college in the district. The State Government therefore, sought permission from the University of Gauhati for starting first year P.U. Classes in Hill College, Tadubi, fromthe session 1979-80. The Gauhati University, in their letter No. Aff/ 143/79/1610 dated 23.11.79, addressed to the Secretary of Education, Manipur, issued the permission to start P.U. first year course from the Session 1979-80.

Further, the Government of Manipur under order No. 3/10/76-S/Se dated 4.3.1981, the four lecturers of English, Economics Education and Political Science was transferred with posts to Hill College, Tadubi with immediate effect in the interest of the public.

The posts of Librarian and Head Clerk also have been transferred to Hill College, Tadubi from other colleges under order No. 1/16/76-SE dated 31.7.1980.

The college was initially attached to the Mao Maram Higher Secondary School for a period of 15 years. There was also, in

the beginning, a tussle among people of severally villages for the site of the College to be situated. Each group of people wanted the site of the College to be situated near their village. And this, of course, was more of an indirect tussle. Yet, it was regrettably one of the factors that resulted in the belated construction of the College building.

The College, after having acquired sufficient members of Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff, started looking forward to upgrade the college. And finally, the Government of Manipur was pleased to accord approval of upgrading Hill College, Tadubi under Order No. 1/18/87-S/SE dated 7.10.1987 to Degree College commencing from the academic session 1987-88 by starting T.D.C. Classes.

The College was initially affiliated to Gauhati University and later to the Manipur University. Consequent upon the establishment of the Manipur University on 5-6-1980 all the then 47 affiliated and permitted Colleges of Manipur were brought under the University. Hill College, Tadubi was also granted affiliation by the Manipur University for the session 1981-82 for Pre-University Arts with the following subjects: English, Alt. English, Economics, History, Political Science and Education.

The College has been granted affiliation upon T.D.C. with effect from 1991-92 in the subjects English, Alternative English, Economics, Political Science, History and Education by the Director, College Development Council of Manipur University under vide letter No. 44/21/80-EDC dated 27.3.1991.

On 10-2-1994, the college was shifted from the Mao Maram Higher Secondary School to the present location known as CHIPI CHIKHU, Tadubi. And in course of time, the Government

of Manipur accorded approval to the opening of T.D.C. 3rd year Course along with honours classes in Pol. Science & History under order No. 3/6/79-s/se(1) dated 3-5-1994 from the academic session 1994-95.

Subsequently, the Manipur University accorded Permanent affiliation to B.A. 2nd Year Course with Political Science & History subjects as Core Subjects under order No. MU/2-1/80/CDC dated 18-12-1995. Along with this the Hil College has been included under 2 (f) & 12 (B) of UGC act. 1956 vide order No. F. 8-28/95 (CPP-I) dated 1st October, 1996.

Now after attaining the permanent affiliation to Degree Course, the College achieved some of the much desired components of its structure.

ADMISSION

The Hills College, Tadubi is purely Government College of Arts upto Honours level. The College admission is made on merit basis by giving preference to higher marks. The candidates must have passed the latest class XII Examinations conducted by Council of Higher Secondary Education, Manipur of its equivalent Examinations from as recognised Board/ Council/University.

HOW TO APPLY

- a) Application form along with the prospectus can be had from the College office on payment of Rs. 250/- (Rupees two hundred fifty) only. Rupees one hundred fifty for prospectus and hundred ffor form.
- b) Duly completed application forms together with required enclosures are to be submitted to the College office on or

before the last date of submission notified by the principal fromtimeto time.

c) Incomplete application forms and forms submitted after the last date for one or the other reason shall be rejected and for which no claim shall be entertained.

ENCLOSURES REQUIRED WITH APPLICATION FORM AT THE TIME OF SUBMISSION

- a) Five copies of mark sheet of Board/Higher Secondary Examination duly attested by a Gazetted Officer.
- b) Five copies of recent passport size photograph.
- A candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/
 O.B.C. shall submit an attested copy of the Caste/Tribe/
 O.B.C. certificate issued by the concerned Deputy
 Commissioner
- d) For a handicapped candiate, a court affidavit shall be submitted along with the application forms.
- N.B.: There will be no quota for admission under pressure from any union or association etc. and this rule/regulation will be strictly adhered to.

NOTES:

- 1. Each paper will carry 100 marks and shall be evaluated at the end of semester examination. The examination of a paper will be of three hours duration.
- 2. Major Indian Languages (MIL) currently approved by the Academic Council are: i) Bengali, ii) Hindi, (iii) Manipuri, (iv) Mizo, (v) Nepali, (vi) Paite, (vii) Hmar.

- 3. Pass Marks for a theory paper of 100 marks shall be 35.
- 4. For an Elective paper comprising of theory and pratical components, the distribution of marks shall be as follows:

- 5. The Honours Papers (H)-507 and (H)-610 may be pratical papers and the pass marks shall be 40.
- 6. The paper on Regional Development (Northeast) shall focus on the study of Society/Polity/Economy/Culture of the seven Northeastern States in general and Manipur in particular. Detailed course-content and material shall be developed in time.

DISCIPLINE:

Students are expected to maintain discipline properly in all spheres of their activities in the College. They have to stictly follow the Rules and Regulations of the College.

LIBRARY:

The college has a seperate building for library constructed under UGC schemes which can accommodate a good number of readers. And the Library has more than 10,000/- volumes on various subjects aprt from periodical journals.

With a view to inculcating in the students with a sense of involvment in social and various development activities at par with normal academic programmes and providing opportunites to the students of the college for a corporate life, development of

personality through community service and also a sense of National Integration, the College has opened an N.S.S. Unit for boys and girls combined.

IDENTITY CARD:

Each and every student of Hill College, Tadubi must have in his/her possession and up-to-date identity card with seal and signature of the Principal.

HOSTEL FACILITY:

At present, the College has a Girls' Hostel and Boy's Hostel located inside the College Campus. It has a lodging capacity of 32 (thirty two) students each. The intake capacity is to be increased in the near future with the extension of the Hostel Building.

ELIGIBILITY FOR EXAMINATION

- He/She must have to prospectus a regular course of studies for not less than one academic semester/one acadmic year in the 1st / 2nd /3rd year of the degree course i.e. all the semester in an affiliated/permitted College or Colleges may be admitted into the 1st Semester/2nd /3rd year degree examination respectively.
- 2. They who are aligible for appearing at the 1st Semester 2nd 3rd year examination in Arts as a regular student shall attend at least 75% of the lectures delivered.
- Students who have attended 60% and above but less than 75% of the delivered lectures may be allowed to appear at the examination as non-collegiate candidate on payment of the non-collegiate fee of Rs. 150/- (Rupees one hundred and fifty) only.

- 4. Those students who have attended less than 60% of the lectures delivered shall not be allowed to appear at the examination.
- 5. Only those students who have been declared to have passed the B.A. 1st/2nd years examination/Semester of the Manipur University shall be admitted to the next semester B.A. 2nd/3rd year classes respectively.
